This course turns the Orff approach towards the repertoire of American Jazz, including a developmental sequence for children 3-14 years of age. Applicable to beginners of all ages: games, songs, speech pieces, body percussion and movement activities, roots music, jazz blues standards and jazz compositions arranged for Orff instruments, along with essential jazz theory and history.

Doug Goodkin is most well known for his work as a music educator and particularly for his innovative application of Orff Schulwerk to the teaching of jazz and multi-cultural music and his ideas connecting Orff Schulwerk to the greater world of education, culture and human potential. Experienced teacher, perpetual student, avid reader, prolific writer, performing musician, social activist, jazz aficionado and piano player, Zen Buddhist practitioner and world traveler, Doug's diverse work and interests are tied together by a vision of celebrating individual flowering within the circle of community. As described by one student: "His work conveys a long, earnest and continuing struggle to present music of integrity in a way that affirms our collective humanity."

Participants may enroll for the full five-day course, or a one-day workshop on August 16.
