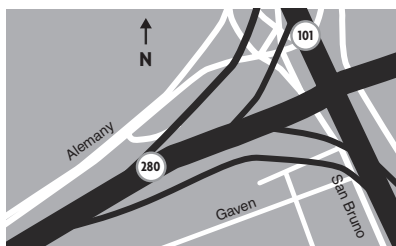

From 101 going north, take the Silver Ave. exit, turn left and then left again at the light, right at San Bruno Ave., continue several blocks and turn left on Gaven.
